ISABEL ROBERTSON MAKES THE GRADE



When the Library Friends of Oak Bluffs established a scholarship in memory of Dick Brown, a founding member and long-time treasurer, members hoped to find students who would share his commitment to community service. We think he would be so pleased with our 2019 scholar, Isabel Robertson.

Isabel is entering her sophomore year at UMass-Dartmouth where she excels in her studies. Inspired by her experiences as a caregiver for a person with serious emotional and behavioral disabilities, Isabel hopes to become a neurological researcher with a goal of creating a drug that will cure or modify the brain chemistry of people with mental illness.

Isabel wants to help reduce the stigma around mental illness, dementia and Alzheimer's. Volunteering at Windermere, a local nursing home, convinced her that this was her career path.

"The experience was enlightening. The residents also inspired me to help people who have neurological disabilities," she said, and added, "Many residents shared their wisdom with me. I considered that one of the best gifts I received while in their company."

Isabel's other volunteer activities include working at an animal shelter, Martha's Vineyard Museum and the Edgartown library while in high school. At college, she volunteered at the YMCA "Share the Harvest Community Farm and plans to volunteer at an animal shelter or a nursing home this year.

Isabel describes herself as an "artsy person" who likes painting, photography, writing poetry and composing music. She likes karate for the discipline and patience it teaches. She also tries to carve out time to read before going to bed.

"My favorite book is 'The Art of Racing in the Rain' by Garth Stein," she said. "It reminds [me] everyone serves a purpose ... to be motivated and think positively. There is also a melancholic touch that will make you reflect on life and its meaning."

Isabel has faced challenges in her life, but does not let them become an obstacle to realizing her dreams and goals. "I want to one day have the honor to make a difference in someone's life. For this reason, I decided to attend college so that what I imagine today can be my future tomorrow," she says.
